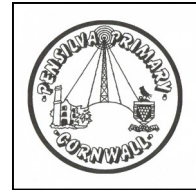

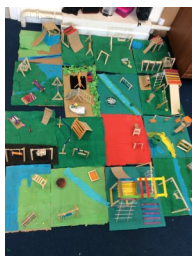
The G7 Summit in Cornwall!

The G7 Environment, Energy and Ocean Ministers will discuss the theme, 'Working together on climate change, oceans and clean energy'. On Tuesday 8th June, it was World Oceans Day and so we decided to research how important our oceans are to us. We discovered oceans cover over 70% of the Earth's surface. They provide us with over half of the oxygen that we breathe every day and absorb half of the world's carbon dioxide. They are also home to about 80% of life on Earth. The oceans help to keep our planet at the correct temperature by absorbing heat from the sun. We need to look after our oceans and so we designed posters to educate others on how important our oceans are and what we can do to look after them. 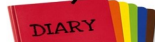


Buzzards Class

It is also an excellent opportunity for you to learn new identification skills. You can either explore the site by yourself or join us on guided walks as we try to find as many plants, animals and fungi as we can.

Who is it for?
You! All ages and abilities are welcome. We need keen eyes to seek out new species. We will have experts and field guides on hand to help identify what you have found.

What can be found at St Martin's?
That's what we're here to find out! We are expecting to find bees, butterflies and other insects using the recently planted wildflowers. There should also be plenty of songbirds in the trees overhead, and possibly signs of hedgehogs.

Early birds can join us at 8:00am to watch us open the mammal traps!
