

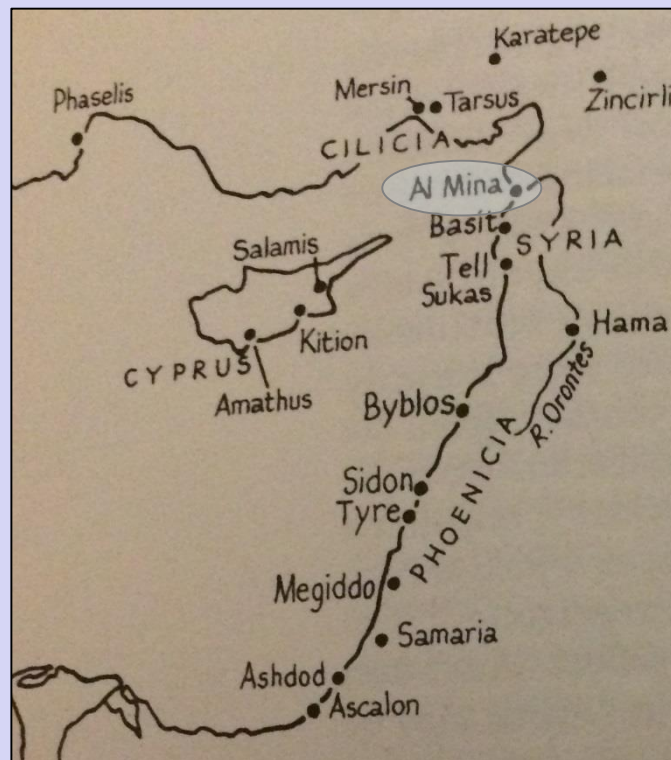
Map of the Mediterranean c.700 BCE

A city on the shore of Syria
opposite Cyprus.

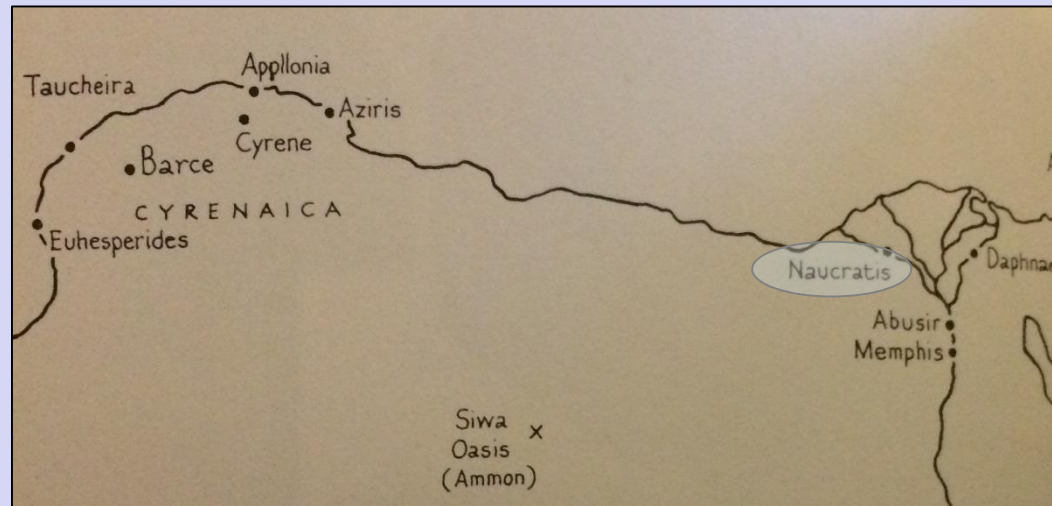
Settled by east Greeks from
Euboea.



Naucratis

On one of the tributaries of the Nile in Egypt.

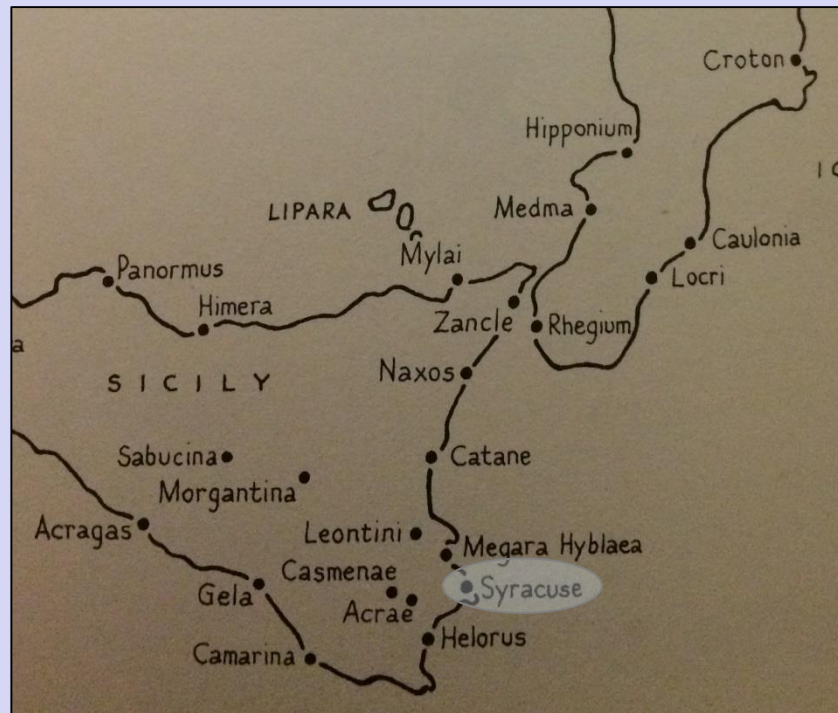
Probably settled by eastern Greeks as well as from the islands of Samos and Rhodes.



Syracuse

On the eastern coast of Sicily.

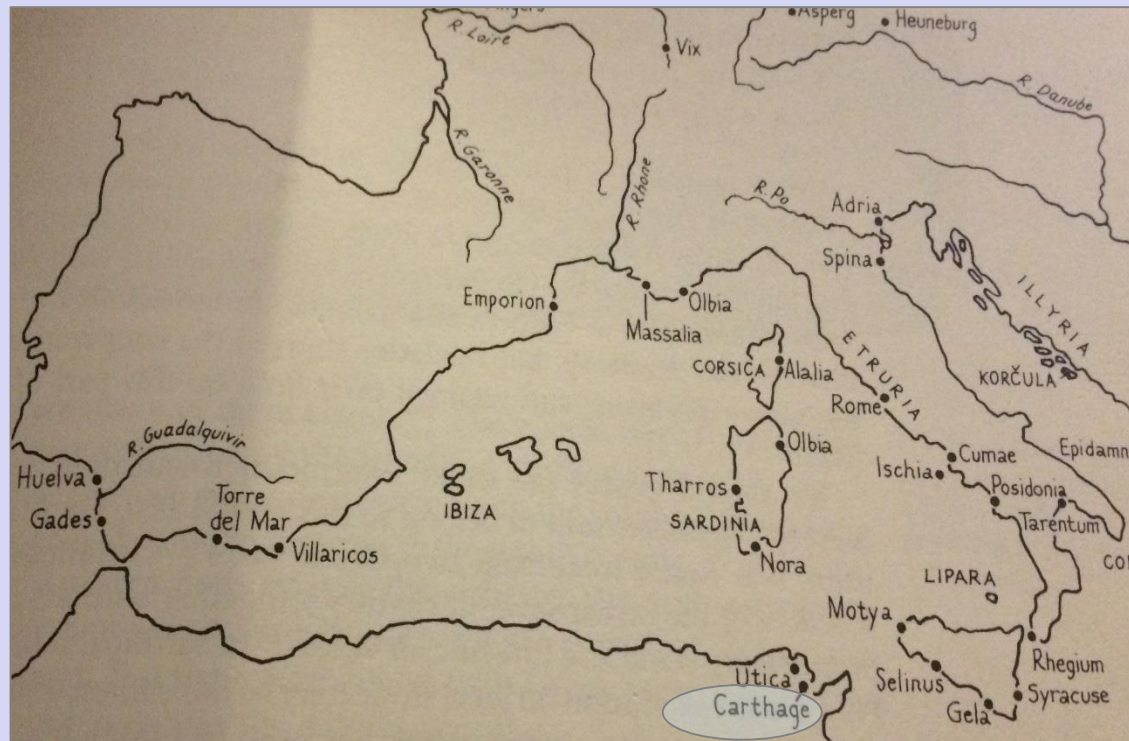
It was set up by Greeks from the city of Corinth.



Carthage

On the coast of what is now Tunisia.

Settled by Phoenicians, possibly from the city of Tyre in what is now Jordan.



Massalia

On the south coast of what is now France, on the banks of the Rhone.

Greeks from the Ionian Islands who had founded Phocaea on the west coast of Anatolia then founded Massalia.
