

This week in science we have been learning about Mary Anning. In Mary Anning's lifetime palaeontology (the study of fossils) was still a very new field of ideas and theories. The fossils Mary Anning found were important for a number of reasons:

- Her major finds included the first ichthyosaur skull (and then the whole skeleton) a complete plesiosaur skeleton of a pterosaur.
- The fossils provide evidence for the ideas of the early palaeontologists.

Buzzards class

In Buzzards, we have been using our imaginations this week to develop some expanded noun phrases that we could use in narrative recounts. We used these to write our own sequels to the story "UFO Diary" that we shared in class.

We have been very scientific this week, carrying out experiments to prove that day and night is caused because the Earth is rotating on its axis even though it appears that the sun is moving. In one of these experiments, we became planet 'Earths' and started with our backs to the sun (night-time). We turned slowly until we could just see the sun on our left (sunrise). As we continued to turn, we were facing the sun (day-time). We continued turning and last saw the sun on our right (sunset). We used this experiment, and others that we took part in, to create scientific explanations of our understanding.

We have continued learning about the Americas - focusing this week on their climate and weather. We considered what we would need to pack if we travelled to locations there.

In Maths, we concluded our addition and subtraction knowledge applying our understanding to solve complex multi-step problems. They were very challenging but we didn't give up so it was a great opportunity to develop our resilience. In PE, we have been active adding more laps to our 'Marathon Challenge' totals and inventing or playing games linked to

Your child's annual nasal flu vaccination is now due

As the autumn term begins, it is highly likely that COVID-19 will again be in circulation at the same time as flu therefore it is important that we do all we can to protect against flu. We are delivering the flu immunisation programme in Cornwall's schools on behalf of NHS England. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable friends and family by preventing the spread of flu

In 2021/2022 all children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please enter www.nhs.uk/child-flu to access information explaining the vaccination programme which also includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate.

Please submit your consent form by midday Thursday 21st October to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form please **telephone 01872 221105** and the team will be happy to help. Please note that as in previous years **you must opt into** the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child will <u>not</u> be vaccinated.

If your child becomes wheezy or has their asthma medication increased after you submit this form, please contact Kernow Health on 01872 221105.

If you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu, it would help us if you still complete and submit the consent form giving the reason. This will help us to plan and develop the service. Please tell us if you need this information in a different format.
