



Please keep to the items listed, as **we cannot accept** coffee or tea packets, fruit or veg bags, yoghurt packaging, muesli, granola any cereals bags, any drinks containers, cheese packets, paper roll bags, rice or pasta bags, pill blister packs, postal packaging ...

Certain manufacturers are sponsoring the programmes and they dictate what can be accepted. *It's not the plastic, it's what was inside the plastic that matters.*

The local community energy group SHARE (South Hill Association for Renewable Energy) is collecting and sorting the items with the aim to reduce waste and send these specific items to Terracycle to be made into new products, whom in return credit the Kicks count charity.

To date, SHARE have set up around 20 local collection points and have a team of helpers to sort and box up, and have earned over 700 pounds for Kicks Count, a charity which aims to reduce the UK's still-birth rate.

We invite anyone that would like to take a look at the operation to contact us and join us. It's quite interesting to see what is collected and we can always use extra helpers.

Here is a full list of items that you can recycle:

- all biscuits & crackers & cake wrappers (no trays)
- triggers & pumps off cleaning products and disposable gloves
- baby food pouches and lids & snack wrappers
- plastic air fresheners and packaging
- flexible packets from dishwasher tablets, salts and stain remover
- used toothbrushes, electric heads, toothpaste tubes and dental floss packaging
- all sweets & chocolate wrappers (no foil or paper)
- all crisp & snacks, popcorn, pretzels & peanut packets (please don't fold or tie)
- clean and dry pet food pouches bagged, biscuits and treats packs
- bread loaf bags that are stretchy
- personal care products in soft plastic tubes, including all plastics in hair dye kits
- Lip sticks, balm & lip gloss, mascara & eye shadow compacts
