In science we have been researching facts about the types of rock in our local area.

This is one of Cornwall's most amazing natural rock formations, a granite tor known as Cheesewring. The name derives from the traditional presses used to squeeze all the liquid out of cheese. With some imagination you can convince yourself that the bizarrely shaped layers of granite rocks look like the cheese presses, or 'wrings'.









Buzzards class

This week the Buzzards have been fully developing our creativity. We have been developing our drawing skills drawing architecture from Pensilva and from the America's. We looked carefully at the shapes of the buildings and then added in all the details such as tiles, windows and doors. Everyone showed a positive growth mindset and were therefore able to make progress.

We have also designed and sculpted dragon's eves as part of our entries to the Lion's Club art competition for the Honey Fair. There are examples on our class page of the first stage of the process as we shaped, coiled and indented the clay to create the effect of a dragon's eye. Buzzard class was given the theme of National celebrations, so we learnt about St. George and the legend of St. George and the dragon and are using this to create our 3D works of art!
