

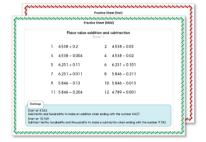

 Check the answers.




























Check your understanding Questions

True or false?

- Half past 5 is half an hour before 6 o'clock.
- We normally leave school at about half past 3.
- We normally get to school at 2 o'clock.
- Half past 12 on the clock has the hour hand pointing straight down and the minute hand pointing straight up.

Write the time half an hour after:

- (i) 10 o'clock
- (ii) half past 6
- (iii) 1 o'clock.

Check your understanding Answers

True or false?

- Half past 5 is half an hour before 6 o'clock. True.
- We normally leave school at about half past 3. True (some may leave later due to after school activities so accept false if that applies to your school).
- We normally get to school at 2 o'clock. False most likely around 9 o'clock.
- Half past 12 on the clock has the hour hand pointing straight down and the minute hand pointing straight up. False – at half past the hour hand is halfway between 12 and 1 - check with a real clock if children are misunderstanding this.

Write the time half an hour after:

- (i) 10 o'clock Half past 10.
- (ii) half past 6 7 o'clock.
- (iii) 1 o'clock. Half past 1.

Again, check with a real clock if children are not understanding this.
